Welcome to Never Is Now. ADL's Annual Summit is the world's leading conference about understanding and defeating anti-Semitism and all forms of hate. We will focus on reversing the rise in anti-Semitism in the U.S. and abroad and fighting back against bigotry of all kinds.

Our dedication to fighting anti-Semitism is more important than ever. ADL's research found that white supremacists have targeted U.S. Jewish institutions at least 50 times since the 2018 attack at the Tree of Life building in Pittsburgh. In just the first half of this year, 780 incidents aimed at Jews and Jewish targets in this country were reported. At least 13 U.S. white supremacists have been arrested for their alleged roles in terrorist plots, attacks or threats against the Jewish community.

Globally, anti-Semitic incidents have been reported in several countries, including in Canada, Turkey, Argentina, Germany, Russia and Kenya. And, as ADL's *Hate Beyond Borders* report discussed, we are seeing a growing trend of American white supremacists establishing contacts with like-minded extremists overseas.

We need to look at these disturbing trends unflinchingly, because knowledge is power. The more we understand about the underpinnings of anti-Semitism, especially the current resurgence, the more we can do to prevent it and fight it. That's why we're gathered here today.

We've assembled a distinguished group of speakers to address a diverse array of topics and engage us in thought-provoking discussions about fighting hate for good. Please use this program and the Never Is Now app to navigate the Summit so that you don't miss a single opportunity to learn and engage. Members of the ADL staff are also on hand to answer any questions you may have.

ADL is a leading anti-hate organization. Founded in 1913 in response to an escalating climate of anti-Semitism and bigotry, its timeless mission is to stop the defamation of the Jewish people and to secure justice and fair treatment to all. Today, ADL continues to fight all forms of hate with the same vigor and passion. ADL is the first call when acts of anti-Semitism occur. A global leader in exposing extremism, delivering anti-bias education and fighting hate online, ADL's ultimate goal is a world in which no group or individual suffers from bias, discrimination or hate.

What We Fight

~~ANTI-SEMITISM~~

In 1913, we stepped forward and spoke out against widespread attacks against Jews in the media, in the courts and in society. Today, we continue our unyielding support of Jews worldwide. We speak out and stand up against anti-Semitism in classrooms, online and on the streets. Our vigilance knows no bounds.

~~BIGOTRY, BIAS & DISCRIMINATION~~

We confront hate in all its forms to keep it from escalating. We deliver on this issue with authority and discipline—for example, we helped craft the first model Hate Crimes legislation in the United States. We will work to stand up for those who are vulnerable in order to help create a world free from hate.

~~EXTREMISM~~

We fight extremism and abject hate with extensive reach and resources. We vigilantly monitor and investigate individuals and organizations that actively promote hate-filled ideological beliefs and a need for action. We are a global authority on extremism and our efforts are unrelenting.

~~CYBERHATE~~

Hate lives out in the open and hides in the far corners of the web. In response, we search, investigate, monitor and analyze its online presence around the clock. We work with companies whose platforms may disseminate hate speech to prevent that hate from coming to life. From bullying to religious discrimination to civil rights abuses, we root out and remove hatred from screens everywhere.

How We Work

INVESTIGATE AND RESEARCH

ADL tracks extremism of all kinds and releases original research on trends in hate both offline and online—from the role of misogyny in white supremacy to the potential for artificial intelligence to identify hateful comments.

ADVOCATE AND ASSIST

ADL works with elected officials and policymakers to ensure the protection of American civil rights. We file legal briefs in most of our nation's major civil rights cases. Together with social media partners, we advocate against cyberhate. We fight hate and bias with diverse coalitions, companies and individuals.

EDUCATE AND TRAIN

ADL is a principal provider of school programs in the U.S. for anti-bias training, bullying prevention, Holocaust education and anti-Semitism awareness. We also provide training to federal, state and local law enforcement on implicit bias, police-community relations, extremist threats, hate crimes and cybersafety.

OUR IMPACT

ADL is a force for fighting hate in a fast-changing world. We stand up to anti-Semitism and discrimination, working at the grassroots level to build a more civil society.

Audit of Anti-Semitic Incidents

2018 saw the third highest number of anti-Semitic incidents in the U.S. since ADL started tracking this data in 1979. Of 2018's 1,879 incidents, the shooting in Pittsburgh was the single deadliest attack against the Jewish community in American history.



Global 100

Our G100 Index of Anti-Semitism periodically tracks anti-Semitic attitudes worldwide with recent surveys focusing on Europe, where Jews are feeling increasingly insecure.



Hate, Extremism, Anti-Semitism & Terrorism Map

Developed by our Center on Extremism (COE), ADL's H.E.A.T. Map™ is a proprietary and first-of-its-kind interactive map that details incidents of hate, extremism, anti-Semitism and terrorism.

We Advocate and Assist



Government Relations and Community Engagement

ADL's consistent advocacy efforts resulted in the appointment of Elan Carr, U.S. Special Envoy to Monitor and Combat Anti-Semitism, after two years of the position's vacancy. This exemplifies the impact of our relationships with congressional and government officials, Jewish communal groups, civil rights champions and faith leaders.



Cyberhate

A partnership among ADL, Facebook, Google, Microsoft and Twitter, ADL's Cyberhate Problem-Solving Lab brings together leaders on both the policy and engineering teams at these tech giants to discuss innovative solutions to the problems of hate online.



Community Security

To enhance security awareness, preparedness and responsiveness across communities in the wake of the tragedies in Pittsburgh and Poway, ADL formed the ADL-SCN Partnership with the Secure Communities Network (SCN) to take action on critical issues affecting the safety of the Jewish community.

We Educate and Train



On Campus

To equip middle school, high school and college students with effective responses to combat anti-Semitism, BDS and anti-Israel bias, ADL created an interactive resource for parents and students, **Think. Plan. Act.**



To address incidents of bias and hate on campuses, ADL developed **Hate/Uncycled**, a tool for prevention, preparation, response, healing and education for administrators and students.



With Law Enforcement

To educate law enforcement to protect communities from anti-Semitic incidents and to safeguard individual rights, our **Law Enforcement & Society** Program brings officers, including all new FBI agents, to the U.S. Holocaust Memorial Museum for a full-day, immersive training.

In Schools

To empower middle school, high school and college students to combat anti-Semitism and anti-Israel bias, our **Words to Action** program has provided interactive education for students since the 1980s to respond constructively and effectively.

In Communities

With consistent commitment to stimulating learning and community engagement, ADL's **25 regional offices** hold regular community programs and forums.

With Young Leaders

To inspire activism and train the next generation of advocates at local, state and federal levels, ADL established the **Glass Leadership Institute (GLI)** over 20 years ago as our cornerstone leadership development program.
